The container is still in the foyer! Thank you for your generosity.

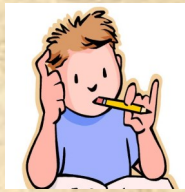
The goods will be handed over to the Vinnies towards the end of next week so you still have time to contribute. Even just one item per family will make a huge difference.
