Talofa lava! This week is Samoan Language Week, 29th May - 3rd June. The Samoan language is the third most commonly spoken language in New Zealand, immediately following English and Te reo Maori and the theme for 2017 is: "Ma'au i lou ofaga. Maua'a lou fa'asinomaga" – "Keep your identity alive to thrive". In classes this week, the children have been learning some common words, phrases and songs in Samoan and we have been very fortunate to have some 'in class' experts to help support us.

The Board of Trustees had its third meeting for the year last week. This followed a meeting which the Board attended at Aotea College to update Boards of Trustees from the 9 primary and one secondary school in our Community of Learning (CoL). Our CoL is formed from schools in our immediate area who work together to form a community, sharing and implementing common learning objectives. CoLs are a Ministry of Education initiative which has been implemented from Government policy. This meeting was an opportunity to discuss the CoL progress so far and the achievement challenge. St Theresa's is a member of the Northern Porirua CoL. We have been actively involved in this initiative, with Donna taking a leading role to ensure that St. Theresa's Catholic School's special character is reflected in targets and decisions made.

I am sure you have all heard the result of this year's Carnival!! A total of \$35,908 was raised - an awesome outcome. Many thanks go to the organising committee for another huge effort. The Carnival delivered a significant amount of funds that will be spent on continuing to create an innovative learning environment for our children.
